1. **Artifact** – Having a man-made object that represents or connects to your topic, and you EXPLAIN it’s connection. *NOT* something you would have had at school anyway.
2. **Powerpoint / Poster** – It is expected you will include at least three images and the SIX THEMES OF HISTORY for your topic. At a glance, people should be able to understand the key things you want them to. Better grades are given for those students who use images, video, sound, etc. to truly “show” us what the importance is of this. CHECK FOR SPELLING / GRAMMAR!
3. **Your Presentation** – On the day you present you are expected to be at school ☺ Also, to have some information you can share, not just reading your powerpoint or poster to us, but telling us why this topic is interesting to you. **If you have any objects, food, or posters to show or share, that will add to your points.**

ALSO, Don’t forget your HANDOUT is due as a separate assignment

ALL Powerpoints must be emailed to CPT Curtis (I WILL respond with “Got it”) OR on a flashdrive. I recommend getting them to me BEFORE the day you are to present. It is YOUR responsibility to make sure it’s ready to go. Having to log into your email the day of is NOT acceptable (and you won’t be allowed to use my computer)
